Kenneth Ng'ambi



KENNETH NG'AMBI, a farmer in rural Zambia, longed to be trained for the pastorate. When CCM offered theological training near his area, he rode his bicycle 10 miles to attend classes. During the rainy season, he would push his bicycle on the muddy village roads to the school, always carrying a large bag of vegetables on the back. Though he travelled the farthest distance, he was always the first student to arrive at the campus. Leaving his home three days before classes, he first sold his bag of vegetables in town to pay his tuition fees. Though Kenneth had limited education and literacy, he listened intently to the lectures with incredible heart. He completed his studies after two years, graduating near the top of his class with a Diploma in Missions. After graduation he returned to his home village, and later other villages to successfully plant Christ's church. His dream of becoming a pastor was fulfilled and today, 25 years later, he still pastors. Kenneth's story is one of grit determination to get theological training to answer God's call, despite the challenges before him.
